Crime and punishment moved in opposite directions, with race mediating the disjuncture. There is scant evidence that the increase in punishment accounted for the decrease in violent crime during the late 1920s and 1930s. Even after the surge in conviction rates, law enforcers failed to convict the majority of killers and robbers.

Medieval Japanese criminal sentences also differed depending on the perpetrator's social class. Samurai who committed serious crimes were often given the right (or the obligation) to commit seppuku—a form of ritual suicide in which the offending samurai disemboweled himself with a dagger.. As with the justice system generally, samurai had special privileges when it came to punishment.
