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## Guided Reading Groups 5th Grade

We have Guided Reading/Centers Monday-Thursday from about 1:10-2:00 and I rotate through four groups. This means each center is 12 minutes long, with about 30 seconds for a transition. 12 minutes can fly by, so the students have to work on getting those transitions DOWN.

I usually have about 5-6 groups of students, depending on class size. I meet with my below grade level reading groups four days a week. My on-grade level and above-grade level groups meet with me 2-3 days a week. When I meet with my guided reading groups, we read books, magazines, or passages depending on the strategy/skill we are focusing on.

## **Small Group Guided Reading Structure for Less Stress**

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Optional Quick Write ~ Students write 5-6 Fluency Words on white boards (not necessary for grades 3 and up). Old Story ~ Students reread for 4 minutes a portion of yesterday's book or chapter for fluency and accuracy. Teacher takes a running record on 1 student. Mini-Lesson ~ The mini-lesson is based on teacher observations of students' needs from YESTERDAY'S book. Introduce the skill in ...

### **How to Teach a Guided Reading Group & Best Practices ...**

Guided Reading Question Cards. During guided reading, I may be reading with one student while the other members of the group are reading independently at the table. Here's where guided reading question cards come in handy. Students can think about or even use them to complete a written response so they are ready for discussion.

So, this is what our guided reading time looks like. With my below-grade level group, I plan 20 minutes, but my two on-grade level groups get 15 minutes. Not included above is my above-grade-level group - we have moved completely to Chapter Book studies - Frog and Toad, Horrible Harry, Cam Jansen, etc.

The easiest way to teach a strategy group is to have the students bring their independent reading books to the group. This cuts out a lot of the planning time. I used to spend hours gathering materials for my guided reading groups. Now, if the strategy can be found in most books, I just have the students bring their books to group.

## **Guided Reading Groups Worksheets & Teaching Resources | TpT**

Groups of 3-5 students are the ideal size. Guided reading works best when there are fewer than 6 students working together. But if you teach in a school with large class sizes, you could go up to 8

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students in a group if you really need to. Try not to have more than 5 groups of students.
