Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 The Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 is also known as HASAW or HSW and most health and safety legislation is contained in it. HASAW places the duty on employers to take responsibility for the health and safety of their employees at work “as far as is reasonably practicable”.

Health and safety legislation in the UK is drawn up and enforced by the Health and Safety Executive and local authorities (the local council) under the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 (HASAWA). HASAWA introduced (section 2) a general duty on an employer to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the health, safety and welfare at work of all his employees; with the intention of giving a legal framework supporting 'codes of practice' not in themselves having legal force but ...
