One of Edgeworth's first publications was her feminist essay Letters for Literary Ladies (1795), a plea for reform in women's education. In 1802 the always sensible Maria and her father travelled to France during which a Swedish courtier Monsieur Edelcrantz courted her, though her loyalty to Ireland kept them from marrying.
