Parenting education is a process of providing knowledge and skills that parents need to fulfill their role. Parents learn how to establish and maintain a close, nurturing, emotional bond with their children and to foster healthy cognitive, physical and social/emotional development in their

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children, teaching the information and skills that children need to thrive.

What is Parenting Education? Who Provides Parenting ...

Social and emotional learning (SEL) involves acquiring and effectively applying the knowledge, attitudes and skills to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions.

Parent Education Programs. Parent education programs focus on enhancing parenting practices and behaviors, such as developing and practicing positive discipline techniques, learning age-appropriate child development skills and milestones, promoting positive play and interaction between parents and children, and locating and accessing community services and supports.

Parent education reduces the risk of child abuse and neglect by encouraging positive parenting practices that promote safety, well-being, and permanency for children and families. The Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA), as reauthorized in 2010, identifies parent education as a core prevention service.

There is also a correlation between parents' education level and families' income level. According to the National Center for Children in Poverty (NCCP), the less educated a parent is, the more likely the family will be low-income. The NCCP study found 86 percent of children with parents who have less than a high school degree live in low-income families, compared with 67 percent of children with parents who have a high school degree (but no college education) and 31 percent of children ...

Parent involvement in schools is the first step to parent engagement and, ultimately, parent partnership. When parents and teachers work together to establish a thriving classroom, the effect on their students is profound. Students with engaged parents don't just have high test scores: their attendance, self-esteem, and graduation rate rise, too.

How Parent Involvement Leads to Student Success ...

The parent-school relationship is one that should begin early, a fact recognized by both the U.S. Departments of Health and Human Services (HHS) and Education (ED). In May 2016, these departments issued a joint Policy Statement on Family Engagement from the Early Years to the Early Grades to recognize the critical role of parents in promoting children's success starting in early childhood systems and programs:

In general, parenting programs for young children have varied based on the theoretical orientation of the intervention model (e.g. social learning, 6 attachment 7), the developmental status of the child (e.g. prenatal, infancy, preschool-age), and the breadth of child behaviours targeted for intervention (e.g. externalizing problems, social and cognitive outcomes).
