Breast specimen handling and reporting in the post ...

Benign lesion that is the cause of most breast lumps found in younger women of reproductive years (age 30-menopause) Fibrocystic changes of the breast are NONPROLIFERATIVE and have NO increased risk of cancer in and of themselves. Atypical hyperplasia (ductal or lobular) can mean there is an adjacent in situ or invasive cancer
