Mercury Labeling. As of July 1, 2007, products that contain mercury in any form must indicate mercury content via a labeling process in order to sell those products legally in the state of Vermont. Most types of LCD displays use CCFL backlights that contain small amounts of mercury. The mercury is necessary in order for the backlight to function properly.

What must a label on a product that contains mercury look like? A label must appear as either words or a combination of words and symbols to indicate to the buyer that mercury is present in the product and that the product should be properly disposed of or recycled in accordance with the hazardous waste provisions of the law.

Labeling requirements generally mandate that a mercury-added product has a visible and durable label that indicates that it contains mercury and should be managed or disposed of properly. The states also require that the product packaging bear a label that is visible prior to purchase indicating that it contains mercury and should be managed or disposed of properly. Individual state requirements may vary.

NEWMOA - IMERC Labeling Guidance

Fluorescent lamp makers, including General Electric, Sylvania, and Phillips, will soon be required by Vermont law to label all lamps containing mercury sold in-state. Yet many lamp makers are now expected to label all of the estimated 600 million mercury lamps sold each year across the U.S., according to recent news accounts attributed to their representative.

Mercury-Containing Equipment. 40 CFR part 273.9 defines mercury-containing equipment as a device or part of a device (including thermostats, but excluding batteries and lamps) that contains elemental mercury integral to its function. Some mercury-containing equipment meets the above definition but is not universal waste.

Labeling Universal Waste Containers for On-Site Storage ...

Properly identify mercury-added products by labeling each collection container with, " (Waste) or (Used) or (Universal Waste) Mercury-Containing products." Store containers for no more than one year. Broken mercury-added devices must be managed as a hazardous waste.

Products Containing Mercury Regulations (SOR/2014-254)

(a) For transportation by aircraft, mercury must be packaged in packagings which meet the requirements of part 178 of this subchapter at the Packing Group I performance level, as follows: (1) In inner packagings of earthenware, glass or plastic containing not more than 3.5 kg (7.7 pounds) of mercury, or inner packagings that are glass ampoules containing not more than 0.5 kg (1.1 pounds) of ...

Determining whether your mercury-containing lamp is hazardous waste. Under federal regulations, the vast majority of mercury-containing lamps are considered a hazardous waste. If you do not test your mercury-containing lamps and prove them non-hazardous, you must assume they are hazardous waste and handle them accordingly.
